### **About Our Presenter:**

Clay joined WPX in 2014 as Senior VP of Operations & Resource Development. In 2015, he was promoted to Chief Operating Officer. In 2017, he was also named President. He is recognized for being a catalyst for change.

Clay has more than 20 years of experience, both onshore and offshore and around the world. He has a master's degree in petroleum & geosciences engineering from The University of Texas at Austin and a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering from Texas A&M.

WPX is a \$10 billion energy company that employs 600 people, including 440 in Tulsa. WPX has received more than 40 awards for social responsibility, environmental stewardship and civic involvement. Nearly two-thirds of WPX's workforce report into Clay's organization, which is responsible for executing WPX's drilling and development plans. WPX's capital budget averages just over \$1 billion per year to drill new oil wells

Clay was the chair of the 2018 Tulsa Heart Walk benefiting the American Heart Association. WPX employees raised \$235,000 for the Heart Walk, finishing first in fundraising among all local companies. Overall, the citywide campaign raised \$1.1 million.

### CLAY GASPAR PRESIDENT AND CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER,

### **Program Description:** "The Courage to Change"

Clay is the President and Chief Operating Officer at WPX Energy. He's been part of helping oversee a massive business and cultural transformation at the company which involved more than \$8 billion of buying and selling oil and gas properties.

He will describe three levels of ethical decision making that have been instrumental throughout the process, including quick wins, tough calls and what he refers to as the "not-so-instant replay." He'll discuss key decisions WPX faced at all three stages and what the company learned in the process.

Says Clay: "Every level gets progressively more difficult. The hardest of all is to revisit something you've previously decided and reverse course. It takes courage, honesty and admitting you could have done something differently."


