BRETT PRATT

Brett Pratt is the President for United States Beef Corporation (US Beef), a closely held organization headquartered in Tulsa, Oklahoma. US Beef is the largest Franchisee of Arbys Roast Beef Restaurants in the world, with over 334 locations in eight contiguous Midwestern and Western states, including Colorado, Idaho, Wyoming, Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri, and Illinois. US Beef is also a franchisee of six Taco Bueno Restaurants located in Northwest Arkansas.

Pratt has an extensive background in tax, accounting and finance working in public accounting for several years. He has worked with US Beef since 1983 as a tax and business consultant before serving US Beef as its CFO since 1995. Pratt was named President of the company in November, 2014 the first non-Davis family member to hold this position.

Pratt was elected as Chairman of the Arbys Franchise Association Board (AFA) in September, 2016. The AFA Board works closely with the Arbys franchisor (ARG) in matters of common interest to the Arbys system and collaborates on advertising and promotional campaigns. Pratt also served on the ARCOP Board, Arbys cooperative purchasing group, since 2003, and was Chairman of the Board from 2008-2016. He has been active in several charitable organizations, and serves on the School of Accounting Advisory Board at Oklahoma State University. Pratt was nominated and selected as one of twenty Men of Distinction in the Tulsa Business Journals class of 2013. He is also a member of the American Institute of CPAs and the Oklahoma Society of CPAs.

He is a graduate of Oklahoma State University, and received his Masters Degree in Taxation from the University of Denver.
